As many know, the linchpin of the Patriarchal paradigm is the global economic system of money based in interest. Everything comes back to money and the power derived from it. All of the pollution, ecological destruction, human rights abuses, war, depletion of Earth’s natural resources, the eradication of beauty, and virtually anything one can name that is out of balance on our planet all comes back to the issue of money. If it weren’t for the incentive of money—in its current form—people and corporations would not be driven to gobble up Earth’s resources and pollute the Earth as if there were no tomorrow. We would not be waging wars and engaging in other forms of domination, destruction and inhumane, insane acts if it weren’t for money and power.

If one examines this situation for more than a few moments, it is not hard to see that if we continue on this path of self/planetary destruction, humanity is doomed. Our beloved Earth is dying, and we cannot continue to exist here without resources such as clean water, clean air and fertile soil to grow food. Unless we change our mindset and behavior, we are headed down a collectively suicidal path. “Only when the last tree has died and the last river has been poisoned and the last fish has been caught will we realize that we can’t eat money,” as the ancient Cree proverb says.

How do we do this? How do we make the changes necessary to live sustainably on our precious planet? Not only how do we live sustainably, but beyond that, how do we create a world where we can live fulfilling, meaningful and inspired lives, not feeling like we are slaves to debt, to earning a living and to less than inspiring jobs, which seem to be the plight of the vast majority of humans on the planet now? Contemplating the scope of the issue can feel overwhelming and too daunting even to fathom.

As those on a spiritual path know, changing our inner reality is the first step. Healing the places inside of us where we are out of balance, do not live from the heart and feel separate and disconnected is the most important and empowering thing we can do. The healing of the Earth begins inside each one of us. Heal and balance the inner consciousness, and the outer world begins to reflect that balance and wholeness back to us.

Because money is such an all-pervasive force, touching virtually every aspect of our lives, it is especially important for us to examine and heal our money issues. What blocks us from living in a flow of abundance? What prevents us from living the fully generous and joyful life we aspire to? What part of us believes in the myth that if we just had enough money, everything would be okay? How do we allow money to insulate us, to keep us separate and cut off from others, from nature, from the rest of the world, and to act as a disconnecting rather than a connecting force?

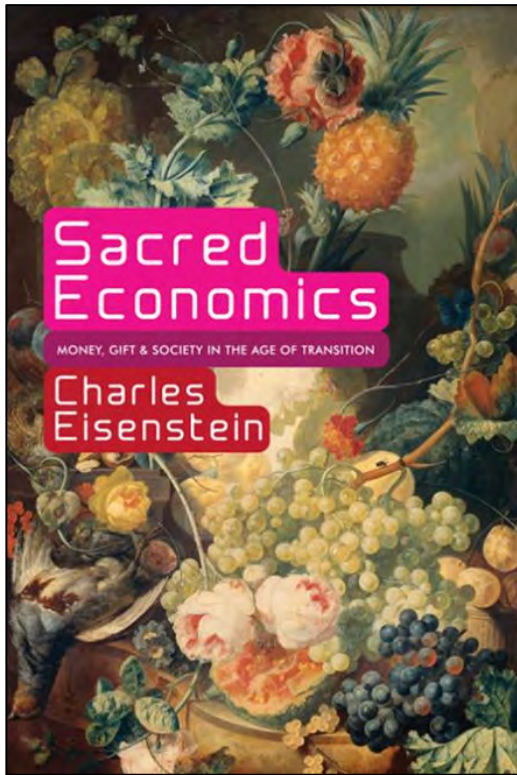
As we shine the light of truth and healing on inner shadows like these, we will naturally create a money system that reflects an integrated, connected, unified reality, a money system which will foster generosity, collaboration, sharing and abundance, instead of what we have now—a system of money based in interest, which fosters insane degrees of competition, greed, scarcity, destruction and countless other forms of separation which threaten



our very survival at this pivotal moment in human evolution. Our current money system is old, outmoded and reflects the consciousness of separation. It is destroying the Earth and prevents us from living loving, caring, meaningful and inspired lives. The old system is dying, crumbling and decaying all around us; we can feel and see it falling apart day by day. And we can also see the signs of the birth of the new. We can catch hopeful glimmers of a new reality if we know what to look for.

Sacred Economics

As part of course, we will be reading and discussing an inspiring, brilliant, new book, *Sacred Economics—Money, Gift and Society in the Age of Transition* by Charles



Eisenstein, which understands all of this and elucidates very clearly the details of this new money system: how it is birthing now and what it can look like, including very specific information about how to create it and how it will foster what he calls, “the more beautiful world my heart tells me is possible”. *Sacred Economics* lays out a well-defined, unambiguous, practical map of how to move from where we are now to where we need to go. The information it presents is not out in left field, airy-airy or ungrounded but is well researched, practical and solid. It beautifully and logically explains how and why the new money system will foster the restoring and preserving of the Earth, her resources and her beauty, and how it will cultivate humanity’s higher qualities, such as generosity, collaboration and sharing, to name just a few of the ideals so many of us have aspired to and longed for most of our lives.

Most exciting is that *Sacred Economics* plants a seed in consciousness. As spiritual seekers, we have known that we need to shift our inner reality in order to manifest a new paradigm of heart-centered consciousness, but never before has so clear a physical map been laid out, showing us how to get there in a practical way. We can no longer say there is no physical solution to the world’s problems! The seed has been planted.

One can’t help but come away from reading *Sacred Economics* inspired and believing that surely we are not far away now from real change and from manifesting the more beautiful world our hearts tell us is possible.

Let us water and nurture this seed by joining together in discussion, by processing our consciousness into greater states of wholeness and clarity and by creating a group synergy to help bring about collective change.

About the course

Our course is the fourth in a series about the journey to a new paradigm of heart-centered consciousness. Ultimately the choice to have an awakened consciousness is the most important decision we can make, and that is what this course is dedicated to. Although there is a topic assigned for each class, we are flexible about the topic of each class. Due to the feeling of uncertainty about the times we are living in, it feels important to leave room for spontaneity each week so that we can discuss whatever topic seems most

important in the moment. We will let the prevailing energies guide us as we process the vital collective issues that arise naturally as well as those that are presented in the course material.

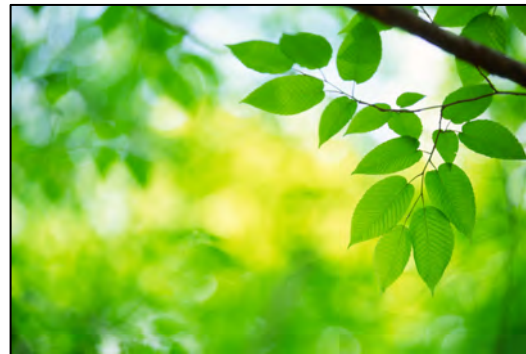

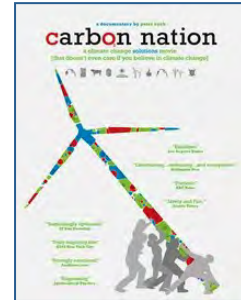

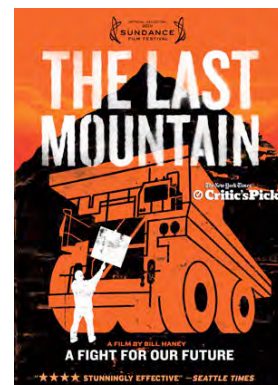
About the film: When the Cold War ended, worry about nuclear weapons also receded. But has the nuclear threat really receded as well? If the U.S. and Russia are no longer in an arms race, why are there nuclear weapons in both countries that are still on high alert? Filmmaker Bud Ryan sets out to discover what possible explanations there could be as to why the posture of Mutually Assured Destruction (MAD) still exists, and how the nuclear powers might free the world from this threat once and for all. *The Forgotten Bomb* examines the political and legal implications of nuclear weapons, but also digs deeper, into the cultural and psychological reasons behind the arsenal's existence. Ryan puts together the pieces of a puzzle that explain why we have the bomb, and how we might finally do away with it.

The Last Mountain

Temple Grandin

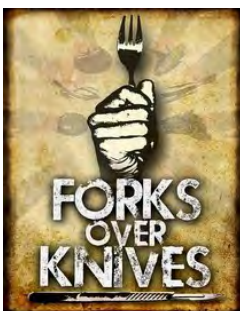

Class 4: *Forks Over Knives*

About the film: Forks Over Knives examines the profound claim that most, if not all, of the degenerative diseases that afflict us can be controlled, or even reversed, by rejecting animal-based and processed foods. The major storyline in the film traces the personal journeys of a pair of pioneering medical doctors/researchers, and reveals that despite broad advances in medical technology, the popularity of

modern processed foods and animal-protein-based diets has led to epidemic rates of obesity, diabetes and many other diseases. Yet this news is not necessarily welcome to lucrative industries such as: meat, dairy, medical, pharmaceutical and health insurance, which work hand-in-hand with government officials and lobbyists to continue earning profits.

February 19

Class 5: *The Pat Tillman Story*

About the film: Pat Tillman's family comes forward to tell the real story about what happened on April 22, 2004, in Afghanistan when the pro football player-turned-U.S. soldier was killed by friendly fire and not the Taliban, as first reported. Amir Bar-Lev's documentary pieces together the Tillmans' search for the truth, how they exposed a military cover-up that led to top-ranking officers and called to the carpet the likes of Donald Rumsfeld.
